B. RELG dept. changes to major, including new courses RELG 160 & 360

Dr. Dan Lee and Dr. Jason Mahn were present to answer questions.

- Dr. Mahn chaired the committee for dept. changes
- Four quadrants require one course from each quadrant
- Different areas of concentration in quadrants
- Quadrants help with staffing
- Reflect cross-cultural interests in two sections
- Course offerings will depend on enrollment
- Students with double majors are required to do a Senior Inquiry
- Students with double majors are strongly encouraged to do a joint SI with approval of both majors
- Concern with combining quadrants ethics, religious practice would eliminate the manifest deed to replace a teaching position
- Concern with staffing courses currently on the books
- Hope RELG 160 would attract FY students
- Need to encourage students to declare major before their junior year
- Can't use proposed number 360 (already exists as a course), so work with registrar

I've summarized what I think are the changes you're trying to make:

**RELG 260 now renumbered to RELG 155 (Encountering Religion)** 

**RELG 355** new course (Theorizing Religion)

RELG 360 stays as RELG 360 (Jesus of Nazareth)

RELG 450 stays as RELG 450 (but credits go from 3 to 1)

RELG 460 now renumbered to RELG 455 (and credits go from 4 to 3)

Note: 450 and 455 (both now "listed" as "Senior Inquiry" probably should be titled somewhat differently)

- C. Chinese Contract Major proposals from Mason Broxham & Sarah Althaus Mason Broxham, Sarah Althaus and Jen-me Ma were present to answer questions and offer information to support request for contract major
  - Mason and Sarah are currently juniors.
  - Students want to show level of expertise, dedication and value in subject
  - Students were not aware of contract major
  - Students discussed the possibility of a Chinese major with the Dean

- Students apply for a contract major in writing to EPC, by spring term of their sophomore year, prior to their final 60 credits
- Contract majors are required to have courses from three different departments
- Asian studies major is available
- Concern with interdisciplinary work
- Focused major
- Chinese department currently does not have a major
- What will the students gain from the contract major

- It could also be possible to request EPC members to communicate with their Division to discuss Senior Inquiry and to forward information to the SI subcommittee
