#### **September 11, 2012**

A. Discussion for Senior Inquiry

Background

Research of offering SI Funded through Teagle Foundation

Worked with Wooster, Allegheny and Washington College to review their Senior Inquiry experience 3 year grant / for 2 years a number of pre-post survey of both students and faculty, focus groups of students, faculty and administrators. President Bahls felt we were well situated as a Liberal Arts college to promote student research through SI

#### •Concern:

Faculty workloads and faculty staffing / What is the required number of students

Would administration consider removing SI from departments

Students with double majors may select to do only one SI

Students overload of more than one SI in same term

Should every student be required SI

How ambitious is SI to be for students

Is this to be a reflection of what the student is to do in the profession of the major / What is the reflection component

Disparity in projects can happen between departments and within departments

What is the goal of Senior Inquiry

Is this an undergraduate research program

How many terms should be considered for SI

Should SI be rigorous and substantial in-depth of focus in the major

Encourage common requirements across departments

What are standards of SI

Departments have not articulated purpose for how SI fits within their programs

Costs of Research for SI

Is there ongoing monitoring within departments and established structure for SI

Is SI a skill demonstrating that inquiry skill in the major

Is SI in-depth into one particular topic

Is the SI substantial in meaning and impact

Is there a need for public presentations of SI

Establish policy of SI and consider another committee to monitor SI

To select members of EPC to draft a new charge for SI policy that will be brought back to EPC Committee for review and discussion. Proposed consideration of committee will be setting guidelines for SI, request Division representatives to review SI, and should a committee be formed to oversee SI. Also, it was mentioned the committee would consult with the Natural Science and Fine Arts Divisions for input.

B. Credit hour policy

Discussion:

- Policy to be on record for HLC visit
- Rationale: (1) confusion with statement "one quarter hour of credit..."

Suggest: stated as one credit on quarter system?

- Department of Education is concerned with student contact and out of class study
- Laboratory Courses: minimum time in lab and time required for student work outside of class
- Concern with non-standardization of labs within departments
- Concern with student in class and out of class ratio
- How does lab work fit in with assessing courses for determining if they comply with credit policy Does time in and time out of lab factor in to credit
- Independent Study / Directed Study: does not match catalog definition.
- Concern with statement: "During an academic trimester, one..."
- Committee concerned with codifying the current Augustana credit policy
- Do other institutions comply with this policy
- How do we prove student work out of class
- How are students spending their time out of class
- Augustana's Proposed Credit Hour Policy: ... (5 week course) courses meet for 375 minutes / week, with 15 hours (time indicated seems not long enough compared to full term courses please review hours)
- Accelerated courses: are these 3 credit courses, full term courses in 5 weeks needs
  clarification and should be same amount of time in class and same expected time out of
  class study for students as the 10 week courses

  - Concern with statement under Course Material; The format of this class will be blended.
  - Concern with other institutions viewing this Augustana course as on-line
  - Syllabus does not meet face to face contact
  - Recommend on-line courses be approved after Augustana has defined and approved online courses
  - Noted synchronous course

**Action**: To approve course ACCT 203 with the following conditions:

Remove term "blended learning" and specify course as on line synchronous, one credit course only available to Augustana students. EPC Chair will request Senate Chair place on Agenda.

— Augustana students. Note: Accounting Dept. revised the syllabus subsequent to vote, altering in-class, face-to-face meeting time to be first TWO class periods, qualifying the course to be considered hybrid (blended).

In addition, the wording has become more limiting (with respect to who can enroll): The course is now considered to be a blended, synchronous, 1-credit, 5-week course only available to Augustana degree-seeking students and Accounting Certificate students (see new EPC 10/16/12 definition).
