## Certificate Program

- Proliferation
- Faculty should set tight parameters
- Next step, EPC should propose set of parameters and put forth in front of faculty meeting
- 55% of the Senate favored of a limited number Certificate Programs (only 4% said none)
- Next meeting we will work on set of standards to propose at November (winter) faculty meeting. Should use document already have for Certificate Program, clean it up and give to faculty to review before November meeting. Could introduce Ellen Hay's certificate program proposal
- There is a concern about moving too fast, however there are a couple of Certificate Programs ready to move once Certificate Programs policies have been approved..

## On Line Courses

- Openness from Senate to experiment.
- Process of approval, sending courses to EPC.
- Summer on line classes supported by 50% of the Senate, with possible all year at 31%.
- Online courses, if we get green light, should be up by July. Need time table from Margaret Farrar.
- We need thought on how we are going to assess on line classes. Education Dept. professor Mike Scarlett has taught some on line courses before and has offered to attend EPC meeting to inform and answer questions. Also, it might be possible for Deke Gould from Philosophy to attend, he is currently teaching on line classes through Syracuse.
