IV. For Discussion:

A. Outcome of Teagle Pilot program to date: upcoming submission of an immersion Program Dr. Kevin Geedey and Dr. Reuben Heine are preparing a basic 9- or 10-credit structure for three courses intertwined into one program, for fall term 2010-2011. A proposal will be submitted for course content and grading. The immersion will be a 300-level experience for students meeting requirements.

Liesl Fowler commented regarding the immersion grade on transcripts. A term comment, indicating program and included courses, can be indicated on the transcript.

Concerns noted by the Committee: Cost of immersion program, future of the program, condition of the grant, faculty commitment, and number of students involved.

A. Pre-Physician Assistant Program with Biology Major

It was noted the Pre-Physician Assistant Program is a format to advertise types of courses offered at Augustana needed to make the students competitive when applying for programs. EPC is concerned why the decision was made by the SCI division to choose on-line voting.

ACTION: EPC is returning a revised proposal to the Biology Dept. and Science Division for approval of the following revision:

Chemistry 411 (Biochemistry - Must be taken fall term of 3rd or 4th year) *OR* a 300-level biochemistry course

Division Chair Darrin Good emailed EPC a response which has been added to the

archive documents.

B. Pre-Chiropractic Program with the Biology Major

EPC discussion:

- Is endorsement of alternative medicine appropriate?
- Question of diversity of opinion within Chiropractic practice
- Consideration of advising tool for department but not to be listed on website or in catalog
- Is this being used for student recruitment
- EPC is concerned why the decision was made to choose on-line voting

ACTION: Return to Division Chair to request further Division discussion.

At this time no action by Committee. Division Chair Darrin Good emailed EPC a response which has been added to the archive documents.

Discussion: EPC concerns:

- whether programs or areas of study need to be vetted by a faculty group or committee
- website locations and catalog are not consistent and may appear misleading with regard to the listing of concentrations, majors, minors, coordinated-degree programs, advising programs, pre-professional programs, and tracks
- Concern with language in catalog on page 47 in 2009-2010 catalog
- Advising areas be distinctly defined in catalog and website
- Two distinct medias (catalog and website)of information should be consistent
- Explanation be clearly stated in catalog and website for the following: concentrations, majors, minors, coordinated-degree programs, advising programs, preprofessional programs, and tracks

- to discuss process of maintaining website information consistent with the catalog
- possibility of linking all information so changes are made throughout the website once
- ITS contact person authorized to make changes
- Who may submit additions and request changes

C. Attendance Guidelines (from 1/14/10 AS&D meeting)

The proposed attendance guidelines began in SPC. It is a guide for faculty with the understanding the guidelines are changing and evolving. This is not policy, the faculty are not required to follow the guidelines and may continue to use the guidelines they establish.

Discussion:

- Time conflicts of scheduled courses when students have make-up exams or other course required commitments
- Student must be proactive, accountable and responsible to speak to Professor about conflicts
- Percentage of student athletes' attendance in a course
- Faculty may be reluctant to have guidelines
- Hopefully, the proposed guidelines will be a shared and respected understanding of what other faculty members may be following
- Inform Dr. E. Campbell and Dr. M. Farrar about concerns of attendance

D. College Repeat Policy Modification (from 1/14/10 AS&D meeting)

Information researched, most schools in our peer group, allow students to repeat course work. AS&D has developed a policy that grades C-, D, F, must be repeated at Augustana, may be repeated up to 3 times per course, student pays for each course, course is considered part of the 33 credit load per year, the grade is noted on the transcript but the final repeated grade will only be calculated in the grade point average (gpa). This is a proposal for the catalog year 2011-2012. When new policies and procedures are passed, it is not immediately effective unless it is to the benefit of the student (Example: a requirement is waived for general education that will alleviate the student of some requirement). The policy will not go into effect until, at least, the next calendar year. This includes: major and minor requirements, program requirements, policy requirements, etc.

Discussion:

- C- is not transferred to Augustana
- Concern with grade inflation
 Augustana grade point average at graduation last year was 3.24 which placed us 25 out of 36 (near the bottom of the list)
- Courses repeated at other institutions are not accepted at Augustana and may not be reflected on the transcript
- The last grade of a repeated course is reflected in the gpa even if the grade is lower
