- COMM384 (1 cr) is the Service Learning portion helping students find community projects
- SOC206 (3 cr)
- What is the definition of a “service learning” course?
(Guidelines are currently located on “AGES” site)
- Courses are not being approved for “service learning” stand alone
- Approved courses are sought as components of a “service learning” learning community
- “service learning” has only been defined within a Learning Community
- Where are courses to be designated for “service learning”
(Gen. Ed. first approached CVR about “service learning” in an attempt to have more Learning Communities)
- Designate in catalog “service learning” by course to be used for advising and recruitment tool
- Definition of “service learning” needed
- What are the “service learning” courses and where or how are they listed?
- Recommend a suffix indicating “service learning”
- How do we institutionalize “service learning” courses
- Within text of course description in catalog to qualify “service learning”
- Contact Rebecca Poock, Center for Vocational Reflection, about information regarding “service learning” and definition
