E. Additional Discussion: at candidate presentation of Dean, a question was presented to the Dean Candidate regarding blended learning courses as it applies to current Augustana faculty teaching Augustana students. Concern with moving forward on this topic.

- Define blended learning, distance learning, on-line learning
- Development of on-line course in process?
- Is there recommendation to move forward from the Board
- Is faculty committee aware of this move
- Is there intention to make these courses available to non Augustana students
- Is this being considered for summer courses (only)
- Will this be considered for current courses or new courses
- Concern with contact hours and faculty load / suggest required contact hours and definition of contact hours
- Concern with certification of student identity issues and security
- Will all courses be required to come through governance
- Can an existing course change to a distance learning course without governance approval?
- Are courses being currently taught at Augustana that would meet criteria of blended, on-line or distance learning courses
- What are we delivering as an institution
- Financial issues

Action:

- **Recommend EPC has voice in conversation about definition and creation of blended, distance, on-line courses**
- **Survey faculty**

- Request EPC members submit questions to Mark Vincent to prepare survey
- Survey results of peer institutions offering on-line, blended, distance courses
- Seek information regarding issues of current on-line, blended or distance learning courses at other institutions
- Request faculty that have been involved in distance, on-line or blended courses to submit input

April 5, 2011

Continue discussion of on-line courses

Discussion:

- Must define term of on-line courses and proposed policy
- What title to be used for on-line courses (blended, distance, self-propelled, etc.)
- Requirements established for on-line courses
- Synchronized time offered for contact
- How do on-line courses effect image and character of Augustana
- Will this change the perception of Augustana
- What has research shown of "Best Practices"
- What are student reviews of on-line courses
- What are Peers and Aspirants promoting for on-line courses
- Concern with definition of contact time (personal, webcam, internet, etc)
- Will ITS be capable of committing to on-line courses
- What is the financial needs for on-line courses
- Will other institutions be team teaching with Augustana on-line
- Possibilities of integrating courses with other institutions
- Is "time" of the utmost to approve or not approve on-line courses
- What are the reasons for on-line courses
- It was noted many on-line courses are large lecture oriented courses

Concerns:

- Student professor interaction
- How is the quality of student learning measured
- Are current Augustana courses approved for on-line without going through governance
- The value of face to face interaction in the classroom
- Student accessibility with professor and college resources
- Email backlog for student not on campus to contact professor with questions
- Would like policy implemented before offering on-line courses

Actions:

- EPC committee has requested Chair to invite Jon Clauss for open discussion of recommendations and research concerning on-line courses
- Request Chair discuss on-line courses with Academic Dean
- When policy regarding on-online courses has been developed through EPC, move to Senate for approval
- Request current courses being considered for on-line development be approved with consideration for methodology, student contact defined and content of course changes and moved through normal governance for approval

April 12, 2011

A. Discussion of On-Line (Distance) Learning Courses: Jon Clauss & Mark Salisbury attending
Jon Clauss and Mark Salisbury were present to answer questions and offer information regarding online course environment at Augustana.

- Presented a study of 10 Best Practices for Beginning Online Teaching
- Course proposals are being prepared for EPC approval
- What is the institutional effective practices
- Will courses be entirely delivered online
- Recommend a feasibility study
- Is the infrastructure currently capable to offer online courses (concern with bandwidth overload)
- Possibility of combining with International course offerings online
- Develop online course criteria
- Construct a metric or rubric template for online course development
- Offer examples to educators how to meet criteria for online course approval
- Opportunity for students to complete course sequences and graduate on time
- The new use of the SRI has online course assessment indicated on form
- Create online support community
- Existing online at Augustana: email, moodle, lectures online, videos online, outside of class

EPC Committee concerns:

- In the effective practices for online courses, how are suffixes approved
- Will student be prepared for next sequence of courses
- How many sessions of class will be required face to face
- How will learning outcome be qualified
- Define online learning
- Will certain courses be considered off limits for online
- What requirements will be set for instructor/student contact
- In classroom, Professors view students for well being and concerns are forwarded to Dean of Students
- Interaction between student and professor
- Does online courses effect the Mission of Augustana
- What is the criteria of the Online model:
 - Was class size considered?
 - Were lecture courses noted?
 - Were lab courses included?
 - What courses were not included in model?
- Consideration of online courses for summer
- Will online courses enhance learning

It was noted, all of the objectives are not independent and must be considered within a feasibility study and the courses meet Augustana practices and mission.

April 26, 2011 (Discussion continued)

- EPC Committee is concerned with existing courses moving to online without approval
- Need to define online for catalog purposes
- Do online courses meet the reputation of the Augustana mission

Action:

- EPC Committee will draft a statement for recommendation to Senate regarding Online courses at Augustana
- EPC Chair will notify Senate, a policy from EPC will be submitted regarding online courses (Policy was not submitted , Discussion to be continued next fall 2011-2012)

May 3, 2011

B. On-Line / Distance-Learning discussion (John Delaney present for discussion)

Discussion:

- Type of online course development – Hybrid or online summer course
- Develop a survey to see if there is a demand for course

- Department has limited resources with fulfilling current courses needed for accounting major
 - Develop fundamentals of accounting course for non accounting or business majors
 - Course is existing approved course
 - Student would learn about setting up their own business practice
 - Current professor in Business Administration department has expertise in technical security and has done online courses at another institution
 - Would like to offer course end of July early August
 - Professor available to teach summer course
 - Cost for online course
 - If course cost reduced, how many students will be required for course to be offered-to pay instructor and cost of registering course with state
 - Technical considerations to implement online course
 - Would course be completed by August 1 for grades
 - Students informed they would be summer grad., if credit needed to fulfill graduation requirements
 - Number of students needed to cover cost of online course
 - Catalog policy to be considered for online courses-would this course be included in the 9 credits
 - Requirements to advertise online course in state and other states
 - Exam requirements
 - How will course be evaluated for consideration of continuing online
 - Request student input of online course in evaluation
 - Paperwork required to file and cost to offer online courses / state and out of state requirements

- B. Continuation of On-line / Distance-Learning policy discussion

Professor John Delaney, Chair of Accounting Dept., was present to update EPC Committee on proposed on-line, blended course ACCT 200 for summer 2010-2011.

- Course not taught – lack of interest for summer
- Course developed for non accounting majors and is currently in catalog
- Accounting department would like to consider offering to Augustana students as a pilot course for spring term 2011-2012
- Market students interested in being small-business owners
- Course to continue as a 3-credit course
- On-Line, Blended course suggestions:
 Meet with professor once weekly for 10 weeks at designated times; All exams proctored;
 Guest speakers require student attendance; On-Line chat designated times; Videos;
 Exams will be criteria to assess course

Discussion:

- Approval through State of Illinois
- Student / instructor contact hours
- Faculty load issues

- Discuss with Academic Dean approval for pilot course spring term
- What is perspective of student regarding on-line, blended courses
- Currently, Augustana accepts courses for transfer from other colleges offering on-line courses
- Define on-line and blended
- Consider policy to define use of on-line and blended courses at Augustana

EPC Chair will invite Professors Stephen Klien and Bob Tallitsch to discuss on-line, blended courses; these are 2 who may be using these pedagogies already.

Discussion veered onto another topic (Haak driving):

Review of Accounting Certificate Program offered for CPA exam:

Enrollment met the projected 5 students

Tuition for Certificate program is offered to students at ½ tuition cost

Next year, because of the increase in internship placement, projection for course enrollment is 10 students

C. Add new course on permanent basis: Japanese 301/302 (Nagase)
GPG approved them last year on a one-time basis

- Concern with number of students in proposed course.

Approved 1 Nay vote

D. Dean Lawrence's request for input on the Staffing Priorities document
EPC chair requested committee members email suggested document changes to forward to Dean Pareena Lawrence.

Suggestions:

- Consider no spacing between questions to not suggest limited response
- Question: How is the position critical to strengthening (or *maintaining*) ... Maybe divide into separate questions
- Include Program assessment & industry/gender/race issues for faculty (differs by dept)
- Consideration that time for departments to include information in recruitment publications may differ – Note a time table for National and Regional notice deadlines
- Question: Based on national (and/or regional) employment... suggest including contribution to liberal arts education as a critical (explicit) question
