# **AGENDA ITEM II – NEW BUSINESS**

# E. Learning Community Approval

"To approve the Learning Community Proposal for Intercultural Communication and Experiential Education: Focus on Australia – SPCM 300 (Intercultural Communication) and BUSN-INTRO-AKP (International Internship Seminar: Australia) as presented."

**Learning Communities Discussion** 

In light of the October 4<sup>th</sup> learning community workshop, a discussion of how to better support learning communities evolved. Tim Schermer and Nancy Loitz created a spreadsheet to estimate a budget for the learning community incentive proposal which allows faculty to earn one banked course credit for each learning community class they taught. After earning three banked credits, the faculty member must take a course release. The estimated cost of this for year one would be \$65,000, and years after that, the cost swings wildly year-to-year. The estimated maximum cost possible in any given year is \$210,000. This proposal comes at a time when the administration is considering several competing needs on campus....the need for new positions.....possibility of load reductions.....faculty salaries and benefits, etc. Jeff asked the EPC committee how they might suggest these issues be addressed and how to engage the faculty as a whole on setting priorities. Some EPC members felt that the reluctance of faculty to offer a LC is not the lack of compensation, but rather, faculty would rather have fewer classes to teach, i.e., 6 instead of 7. Another reason more learning communities haven't transpired is because faculty just haven't tried pairing up with someone. In addition, some faculty do not have the flexibility in their schedule to offer learning communities even if they desired, for instance in music.

Liesl Fowler indicated that there remains a problem getting the learning community requirement fulfilled by this year's senior class; that there remain approximately 95 seats short. The faculty continue to receive encouragement from Nancy Loitz to bring forward new learning community proposals. Ritva Williams mentioned as a short-term solution, that if AS&D is offering the two LP substitutions for lack of a learning community again this year, the Religion Department has a large number of classes that are available this year that would satisfy the LP requirement.

EPC came to agreement that the Division meetings on October 30<sup>th</sup> should have the learning community discussion/Evergreen committee proposal on their agenda. In November, a faculty forum would then be called to determine if the faculty endorse for the Evergreen proposal. Jeff will also suggest to faculty senate to call a forum on both the learning community and budget issues. Liesl will poll advisors and have on hand what the estimated numbers are for seniors who will not have fit a learning community into their schedule this year.
