About Augustana College

Known for its balance of liberal arts with focus in a major field, collaborative research opportunities, competitive athletic teams and award-winning student activities programs, Augustana College is a selective independent college of the liberal arts and sciences related to the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The college enrolls approximately 2,500 men and women of diverse ethnic, religious and social backgrounds, from across the United States and around the world.

Augustana's athletic teams have won more championships than any other school in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin. The Vikings own a total of 175 total team championships (137 men and 38 women) since the league began in 1946-47. Augustana is currently sixth in the nation in number of CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) Academic All-Americans produced in all sports with 135 as of June, 2011. During the 1990's the Vikings finished third, trailing only Nebraska and M.I.T.

Home to a Phi Beta Kappa academic honor society chapter since 1949, Augustana grants baccalaureate degrees in more than 60 areas of study. Along with a competitive athletic environment, student-athletes can join one or several of the school's 150 student organizations or take advantage of Augustana's wide variety of opportunities for international study. Augustana has a student-faculty ratio of 11:1, and nearly 90 percent of the faculty hold the Ph.D. or the terminal degree in their field.

After strong finish in 2010, Vikings hope to pick up where they left off heading into 2011 campaign

Heading into the 2010 season Augustana head men's soccer coach Brenton Joseph was concerned about replacing 10 seniors from 2009. When his team was 0-4-1 through the first five matches it seemed like his worst fears were coming true. However, a young team caught stride and went 8-7 the rest of the way and fooled the "experts" by finishing fourth in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin.

It is now 2011 and Joseph is looking at an entirely different scenario heading into the season. His Vikings return 17 letter winners from a year ago and there are starters at nine of the 11 positions, including a few spots where there are multiple players who saw starting duty.

"Last year it took our younger guys a while to play at the level we needed," said Joseph who has had his team in the CCIW tournament each of the last two seasons. "Once we understood what it takes to be successful as a unit, we got better."

The Vikings clearly got better as the season progressed. After that 0-4-1 start, things started to shift with a 3-0 win over Cornell on September 15. Augustana ended the year with a 4-3 mark in the CCIW and then played a tremendous game in a 2-1 loss at Wheaton in the first round of the conference tournament.



Senior Brett Blecher is a three time letter winner. He will help anchor the Viking's defense in 2011. The Vikings will look to improve on their already impressive 1.45 goals against average from a year ago.

"We are one year older and one year wiser," said Joseph, who has an overall record of 28-37-9 four seasons at Augustana. "We have more experience now and up and down our lineup and in the off-season we stressed being ready early because that was obviously a problem last year. We have the talent to be pretty good."

Senior Sean Fidlow (**Carmel Catholic HS, Gurnee, Ill.**) was a second team all-conference performer last year and was voted the team's "Best Offensive Player". He led the Vikings in scoring with five goals and four assists for 14 total points. He will be back in his midfield position.

Fidlow will be joined in the midfield by sophomore Matt Shipon (**Elgin South HS, Elgin, Ill.**), senior Brett Blecher (**Marist HS, Oak Lawn, Ill.**), junior Nick Wolfe (**Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and sophomore Adam Wilson (**Plainfield North HS, Plainfield, Ill.**). Shipon scored three goals and had three assists a year ago. Wolfe and Wilson each had one goal while Blecher recorded a pair of assists.

In one forward spot sophomore John McSpadden (**Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.**) returns as a starter after scoring five goals and notching two assists last fall. The other forward position could go to junior Kevin Wyrostek (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**). He was a starter as a freshman in 2009 and last year he had two goals and an assist as a substitute.

The defense will be solid with senior Cory DeGrave (**Fremd HS, Palatine, Ill.**) leading the way. DeGrave was voted the Vikings' "Most Valuable Defensive Player" in 2010. Joining DeGrave on defense will be junior Jason Beckus (**Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and sophomores Michael Buric (**Notre Dame Prep, Scottsdale, Ariz.**) and Evan Johnson (**Glenbard South HS, Glen Ellyn, Ill.**). Senior Kurt Negwer (**Lutheran North HS, Florissant, Mo.**) and sophomore Grant Halter (**Glenbard West HS, Glen Ellyn, Ill.**) will also be in the mix on defense.

A pair of sophomores will be battling for the goalkeeper's position. Tyler Cowherd (**Bettendorf HS, Bettendorf, Iowa**) played 18 games last year and logged 1,667 minutes and had a goals-against-average of 1.51. Steve Zahrobsky (**Downers Grove South HS, Woodridge, Ill.**) played five games and really came on near the end of the season. He sported a 0.92 goals-against-average in 195 minutes.

"We had a nice recruiting class and a couple of freshmen are good enough to make an impact," said Joseph. "Our veterans really had a good off-season and we think we can compete with anybody on our schedule."

Brenton Joseph became the seventh head coach in men's soccer history at Augustana when he accepted the position in June of 2007. His fourth season at the helm in 2010 was marked by a superb showing in CCIW conference play, as he led a team that was picked to finish sixth in the conference to 4-3-0 conference record and the number four seed in the CCIW playoffs. His career record at Augustana stands at 28-37-9 and his teams have been 10-14-4 in the CCIW and have qualified for the last two conference tournaments.

He has extensive coaching experience at both the Olympic Development Program (ODP) and club level in the Chicago area. He has coached the Ajax FX Chicago Soccer Club since 1999.

He was a standout athlete in college, earning third team NCAA All-America honors at Alabama A & M when he helped lead his team to an 18-2 record. He was the team's leader in assists for three years and was a second team CoSIDA Academic All-American. He was also part of an ESPN feature on outstanding minority athletes at the collegiate level. He played one year at Mercer Community College and was part of a team that was ranked number one in the nation and won a regional championship.

Joseph played professional soccer for the Chattanooga Express and was a member of the junior national team for his native country of Trinidad and Tobago.

Joseph joined the Augustana staff after a 10 year run at Benedictine University in Lisle, Illinois where he held head coaching spots with both the men's and women's programs. He replaced Scott Mejia, who compiled a 68-37-6 record in a six year stint with the Vikings that began in 2001. Mejia, who was the head coach for both the men and women, remains the coach of the women's program.

Joseph joined the Benedictine staff in 1997 and served as both the men's and women's head coach from 1997 through 2001. He became solely the women's head coach in 2002 and served in that capacity until 2004 when he took over the reigns of the men's team, beginning with the 2005 season. The men's team had second place finishes in the Northern Illinois Intercollegiate Conference in 1999 and 2000 and in 2005 made it to the championship game of the conference tournament.

His women's teams compiled a record of 50-92-5 during his eight years at the helm and his 2000 team's 14-5 record is the best in school history. Benedictine had a 9.5 game turnaround from the 1999 season and that was the greatest improvement in NCAA Division III women's soccer that season and still ranks as the fourth best improvement all-time in the division. In 2003 he guided the Eagles' women to runner-up finishes in both the regular season and conference tournament as they went 12-7-2 overall and 3-0-2 in conference play.

He served as the assistant men's soccer coach at Alabama A & M in 1994 and was an assistant for the University of Alabama-Huntsville men's program in 1995 and 1996. He helped Alabama-Huntsville to a 16-1-1 record; a Gulf South Conference title and a first ever berth in the NCAA Division II national tournament. He is a 1993 graduate of Alabama A & M with a bachelor of science degree in computer science.

Vikings finish fourth in CCIW and qualify for conference tournament; Sean Fidlow named to all-conference team

The Augustana men's soccer team finished the 2010 season with an overall record of 8-11-1. The Vikings also put together an impressive run in the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin, notching a 4-3-0 mark and earning the No. 4 seed in the CCIW Tournament after being picked to tie for sixth in the pre-season coaches' poll.

The Vikings opened the year on the wrong end of several one goal scores, falling to 0-4-1 with a 2-1 overtime loss to Chicago in the home opener, a 1-0 defeat at Coe, a 2-1 loss at Aurora, a 1-1 double overtime tie at Fontbonne, and a 2-1 double overtime loss at Webster. After facing a lot of early season adversity, Augustana continued to plug away and earned its first victory of the year with a 3-0 shutout of Cornell. The Blue & Gold also followed with a 2-1 win against Simpson to improve to 2-4-1 overall.

After a pair of defeats to Loras (4-1) and Central of Iowa (1-0), Augustana hit its stride with a four match winning streak, the longest of the year. The Blue & Gold scored 12 goals in the four contests and earned four consecutive shutouts along the way. The Vikings edged Carthage 1-0 in the first CCIW league match-up of the season. The team followed with an 8-0 drubbing over Knox, another 1-0 win at Millikin, and a 2-0 home victory against Beloit. The win over Millikin also improved the Vikings to 2-0 in the CCIW. The victory against Beloit closed out the streak and leveled the season record for the Blue & Gold at 6-6-1.

Augustana's win streak finally came to an end when Lake Forest tallied a late goal for a 1-0 double overtime win against the Vikings. Losses to North Park (5-0) and Wheaton (4-2) in the next two games gave Augustana its first league defeats of the year as the Blue & Gold entered the home stretch of the campaign.

Sitting at 2-2 with its postseason fate up in the air, the Vikings pulled out two wins in the final three league games to earn a spot in the CCIW Tournament. Augustana defeated Illinois Wesleyan 2-1 at home and also rallied for a 4-2 victory over North Central in the friendly confines of Ericson Stadium before falling 1-0 at Elmhurst in the regular season finale.

With a 4-3 league mark, the Vikings earned the No. 4 seed and traveled to face top seeded Wheaton in the semi-final round of the CCIW Tournament. The game was much different from the one played just two weeks earlier and it took a late Thunder goal for the hosts to edge Augustana 2-1, ending the season for the Blue & Gold.

Junior Sean Fidlow (**Carmel Catholic HS, Gurnee, Ill.**) led the team with 14 points. He tallied five goals and also had a team high four assists. Fidlow led the team with 68 shots and 28 shots on goal. He also scored the game winning goal in a 1-0 win over Carthage. Fidlow also tallied the lone goal in a 1-1 tie against Fontbonne and scored in conference matches against Illinois Wesleyan and North Central. His hard work was rewarded at the end of the season when he was named to the CCIW all-conference squad as a second team selection.

Freshman John McSpadden (**Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.**) finished tied for the team lead with five goals. He was also credited with a pair of assists, completing the season as the second Viking in double figures with 12 points. McSpadden attempted 26 shots, including 13 on goal. He was also the only Viking to record more than one game winning goal, hitting the winning strike against Cornell and Knox.

Freshman Matt Shipon (**South Elgin HS, Elgin, Ill.**) came close to ending the year in double figures with points, tallying three goals and three assists for a total of nine points. He attempted 20 shots with 11 of them on goal. After an early season goal, Shipon earned his final two goals in league games against Wheaton and North Central, scoring first for the Vikings in both contests.

Seniors Greg Maggio (**Wheaton Warrenville South HS, Wheaton, Ill.**) and Anthony Adeniran (**Loyola Jesuit HS, Ogbomoso, Nigeria**) each scored four goals for a total of eight points. Maggio attempted 24 shots with 13 on goal while Adeniran took 15 and had six on target. Maggio scored the game winner against Illinois Wesleyan, one of three goals he tallied late in the season against league foes. Adeniran recorded two of his goals against Knox.

Senior Sean O'Malley (**University HS, Bloomington, Ill.**) and sophomore Kevin Wyrostek (**Naperville North HS, Naperville, Ill.**) both finished the season with five points. Each player accumulated two goals and one assist. O'Malley took 29 shots with 13 on target and Wyrostek had eight of his 15 shots on goal. O'Malley scored the game winning goal in a 1-0 victory at Millikin. Wyrostek cashed in on a penalty kick opportunity, tallying the game winner against Beloit.

Junior Kurt Negwer (**Lutheran North HS, Florissant, Mo.**) finished with three points on one goal and one assist while a host of Vikings ended the season with two points. Senior Alex Bennett (**Lincoln Way East HS, Mokena, Ill.**), sophomores Jason Beckus (**Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**) and Nick Wolfe (**Neuqua Valley HS, Naperville, Ill.**), and freshmen Grant Halter (**Glenbard West HS, Glen Ellyn, Ill.**) and Adam Wilson (**Plainfield North HS, Plainfield, Ill.**) each scored one goal for the Vikings. Beckus had the game winner against North Central in a key conference win while Bennett won the match against Simpson early in the season with his strike.

Juniors Cory DeGrave (**Fremd HS, Palatine, Ill.**) and Brett Bleecher (**Marist HS, Oak Lawn, Ill.**) also finished with two points, each picking up two assists during the season. Senior Scott Cella (**Geneva HS, Geneva, Ill.**) and freshman Michael Buric (**Notre Dame Prep HS, Scottsdale, Ariz.**) were the final two players to score a point, each picking up one assist.



Sean Fidlow was named to the CCIW all-conference second team in 2010. He tallied five goals and four assists for a total of 14 points.

Freshman Tyler Cowherd (**Bettendorf HS, Bettendorf, Iowa**) handled the majority of the goalkeeper duties with freshman Steven Zahrobsky (**Downers Grove South HS, Woodridge, Ill.**) picking up some action along the way, including a start against Wheaton in the CCIW Tournament. Cowherd played in 18 games and made 103 saves in 1667 minutes of action. He only allowed 28 goals and finished with a goals against average of 1.51 while earning a record of 7-10-1. Zahrobsky was in net during five games and made eight saves while only allowing two goals. He finished with a goals against average of 0.92 in 195 minutes of action. Cowherd was credited with two shutouts and Zahrobsky earned one. The goalie tandem also combined on two more, for a total of five this season.

The Vikings edged the opposition with a 31-30 goal advantage over the course of the season. Augustana held a 290-255 lead in shot attempts and also took 87 corner kicks to just 82 for its opponents.

The College Conference of Illinois and Wisconsin

Now in its 66th year, the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin (CCIW) enjoys a reputation as the "Best Small-College Conference in the Nation." The league was formed with nine charter members (Augustana, Carthage, Elmhurst, Illinois College, Illinois Wesleyan, Lake Forest, Millikin, North Central and Wheaton) on April 26, 1946 in Jacksonville, Illinois. Competition opened in the 1946-47 academic year as the College Conference of Illinois.

Carthage left the conference in 1952 but returned in 1961. In 1967 the name was changed to the College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin to recognize Carthage, which had moved to Kenosha, Wisconsin from Carthage, Illinois in 1962, and Carroll, which entered the league in 1955.

As is often the case with athletic conferences, CCIW membership has experienced some changes since the league's inception. After Carthage left in 1952, Illinois College withdrew the following year. Elmhurst and Wheaton left following the 1959-60 academic year. Wheaton rejoined for all sports but football in 1967 and then for football in 1970. Elmhurst rejoined in the fall of 1967 for all sports but football and for football in the 1968 season. Carroll joined officially with the 1955 spring sports seasons. Carthage returned in 1961 and North Park entered the following fall. Lake Forest dropped out at the end of the 1962-63 year. The last change in CCIW membership came following the 1991-92 season when Carroll withdrew.

Now eight members strong, the CCIW continues its tradition of athletic and academic excellence. The league sanctioned women's sports for the first time in the 1986-87 school year and Augustana participated in the first ever women's competition. That was on September 14, 1986 when the Vikings met North Central in a volleyball match that was held at Elmhurst College.

The College Conference of Illinois & Wisconsin sanctions 21 sports: baseball, men's and women's basketball, men's and women's cross country, football, men's and women's golf, men's and women's soccer, softball, men's and women's swimming, men's and women's tennis, men's and women's indoor track & field, men's and women's outdoor track & field, volleyball and wrestling.

Augustana will welcome its 11th women's varsity sport, lacrosse, for the 2011-12 season. Augustana will also be welcoming men's lacrosse as its 12th men's varsity sport for the 2012-13 season. Neither women's nor men's lacrosse is currently a CCIW sport.

Augustana owns more CCIW team championships than any other school in the league with 175 total. Of those 175, the men have won 137 and 38 belong to the women.

Football was the first sport contested in the CCIW when the league was formed in 1946. Augustana has won more games (309) and championships (21) than any team in the CCIW during the first 65 years of existence. Not only have the Vikings won 21 league titles, but they have also finished second 11 times. Since 1981 the Blue & Gold own at least a share of 17 of the last 29 championships.
